WHERE DO WE GO?

Norwich is a city in Norfolk, England, situated on the River Wensum in East Anglia, about 100 miles (160 km) north-east of London. A city since 1094, Norwich is the country town of Norfolk and unofficially seen as East Anglia's capital. From the Middle Ages until the Industrial Revolution, Norwich was the largest city in England after London and one of the most important.

It has a population of approximately 195,000 and has a very active commercial life and a historical center of great tourist interest. It is a city of temperate climate, located near the sea and surrounded by rivers and lakes.

THE ENGLISH LANGUAGE SCHOOL

Our school has been teaching students around the world since 1994. The school is located in the center of Norwich, less than a 5-minute walk from the main shopping area and 2 minutes from the bus stops. In class, teachers use interactive, communicative lessons to enhance the students' language skills.

BRITISH CULTURE PROJECT

The British Culture Project is the perfect way to work on fluency and build confidence in English. The flexible nature of the course allows students to work to their own level, explore topics that interest them, and expand their knowledge of English.

The British Culture Project is suitable for students of all ages and all levels of English. Lessons are structured to be communicative and encourage students to grow in confidence as they speak.

During lessons, students go onto the streets to interact with local people and investigate the British way of life. Teachers use games, a range of different media, pair work and group work in lessons to ensure that the learning experience is enjoyable and engaging.

Throughout the course, students work towards a final presentation to demonstrate what they have learnt during their time with us. These presentations are creative and dynamic, allowing students to express language and new information in a style that suits them. A presentation might involve drama, using media and computer skills, or a formal style of presenting with notes and diagrams.

Class times are from 09.00 to 12.30 or 13.30 to 17.00. They have a 30-minute break in between.

INTRODUCTION TO EXAMS

Introduction to Exams courses are designed for groups who would like an introduction to what is involved in taking an exam or for groups who would like to build confidence and fluency before entering an exam.

By taking an internationally recognised English exam you have: instant proof of your level, evidence of your ability to study, advantage over others looking to study or work in an English speaking environment and more confidence in communicating in English.

We plan classes to fit the exact needs of our students. In particular, the focus is on exam techniques, exam format and mock speaking papers. There is also a focus on general English skills that are transferable to the exam. We run workshops to support independent study. Our aim is to help students improve their writing, reading, listening and vocabulary building skills. An optional exit test is available.

Class times are from 09.00 to 12.30 or 13.30 to 17.00. They have a 30-minute break in between.

We offer classes providing an introduction to exams for the following Cambridge exams:

- A2 – Key English Test (KET)
- B1 – Preliminary English Test (PET)
- B2 – First Certificate in English (FCE)
- C1 – Certificate of Advanced English (CAE)
- C2 – Certificate of Proficiency in English (CPE)
